PENTICTON, PRONOUNCED "PEN-TIK-TON" DERIVES FROM THE SYILX OKANAGAN NATIONS "SNPINTKTN", MEANING "A PLACE WHERE PEOPLE HAVE ALWAYS BEEN ALL YEAR LONG."

Penticton boasts long, hot summers and dry winters, with over 2000 hours of sunshine each year. This sunny climate is complimented by a stunning blend of rugged terrain, a refined urban centre, a rich agricultural heritage, and a variety of accessible trails ideal for outdoor adventures. Penticton is a place where even if you don't stay all year, you'll continue coming back to make new memories for years to come.

Penticton is the third largest city in the Okanagan Valley and the hub of the South Okanagan. With Skaha Lake to the south and Okanagan Lake to the north, Penticton is one of just two cities in the world situated between two lakes. Our landscape boasts over 15 acres of premium sandy beaches surrounded by wilderness, vineyards and orchards. Our beaches are just the beginning of a long list of outdoor activity options including hiking, cycling, rock climbing, golfing, floating the channel, swimming, kayaking, sailing, kiteboarding, skiing, snowboarding, snowshoeing, and so much more.

With a convenient city centre and only 7 km from Okanagan Lake to Skaha Lake, Penticton is the perfect destination to explore by foot, pedal or paddle. Those looking to enjoy the abundance of farm fresh produce can stroll our farmers' market, forage for their own produce at u-pick farms, savour the local flavours of our diverse culinary scene, or sip at one of our numerous wineries, craft breweries, or nearby cideries and distilleries. The crown jewel of the region is the Kettle Valley Rail (KVR) Trail offering beautiful views of the Okanagan Valley perfect for walking, biking or horseback riding.

Our unique location in BC makes Penticton an iconic destination all year long. So whether you're attending a large event or festival, or bringing your bike, skis, paddle board or hiking boots, our trails and our community welcome you each and every season.



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GETTING HERE

Welcome to your guide to Penticton, a vibrant city in British Columbia's South Okanagan Valley. You'll find us right where the action is - in the heart of BC's wine country, perfectly placed for your southern Okanagan adventures.

BY CAR

Pack up the car and hit Highway 97 - a route that's brought road-trippers to Penticton for generations. The city makes an ideal base for exploring, with easy connections to the Trans-Canada Highway (Highway 1) and the Crowsnest Highway (Highway 3). Before you start your drive, check DriveBC.ca for road conditions and travel times.

BY AIR

Our Regional Airport (YYF), just 10 minutes from downtown, offers direct flights through WestJet to Calgary with seasonal service to Edmonton, and Pacific Coastal Airlines connects you to Vancouver, with Budget Car Rental available right at the airport.

For travelers connecting through major international routes, Kelowna International Airport (YLW) is a scenic 1.5-hour drive north of Penticton.

GETTING AROUND

Leave your car keys behind - Penticton is perfect for exploring at a slower pace. With paths and trails connecting the whole city, you can walk, bike, or paddle your way through your vacation. From the moment you land at Penticton Regional Airport, you have choices. Park your car affordably at the terminal, catch a taxi, or grab a Uride through the app. Once you're settled, you'll see the city like locals do, catching all the spots you might miss from behind a windshield.

BY TRANSIT AND RIDE SERVICES

- Uride: Our local ride-sharing app gets you around town with a tap
- Taxis like Eco Taxi or Penticton Taxi handle everything from airport pickups to wine tours
- Wheelchair and scooter accessible buses serve Penticton's neighborhoods and connect you to Naramata, Osoyoos, and Kelowna

PENTICTON BY SEASON

SPRING

Fresh air and bright skies welcome you to spring in the South Okanagan. As vineyards and orchards burst into bloom, temperatures climb from 8°C to 22°C. With just 2-4 days of rain per month, spring offers perfect conditions for outdoor activities.

SUMMER

Summer brings warm days at an average of 30°C, low humidity, and clear skies. Cool off in our fresh-water lakes, grab ice cream downtown, or relax on a shaded patio. Bring sunscreen - our sunny days and busy beaches make this our peak season.

FALL

Fall starts warm with September highs of 24°C, then cools to 5-15°C. The harvest fills vineyards and orchards with ripe fruit, while sagebrush scents the air. You'll find ideal conditions for hiking, biking, and wine tasting.

WINTER

Winter stays mild in Penticton, with highs up to 5°C and lows around -4°C. Snow falls about 40 days through the season, setting up perfect conditions for skiing, skating, snowshoeing, and fat-biking. Many visitors escape colder regions to enjoy our gentler winter weather.



EXPLORE WITHOUT LIMITS

Leave the engine off and let Penticton's natural rhythm take over. Just 7 km separates our two lakes, putting you in the heart of everything - from hidden cafés and local shops to sandy beaches and mountain trails. This is your invitation to slow down, breathe deep, and explore at your own pace.

BY FOOT

Discover Penticton step by step. Wander downtown's vibrant streets, follow lakeside boardwalks past busy beaches, or climb to the iconic PENTICTON sign on Munson Mountain for a view that captures it all.

BY PEDAL

Penticton offers rides for every style. Take in lake views along the scenic 45 km Skaha Lake loop, or wind through vineyards on the historic Kettle Valley Rail Trail. Mountain bikers can test their skills on the singletrack trails of Three Blind Mice and Campbell Mountain - some of BC's best terrain. Don't have a bike? Our local shops have you covered with rentals from cruisers to e-bikes, getting you ready to explore on two wheels.

BY PADDLE

Our two lakes offer endless ways to get on the water. Launch a kayak into hidden coves, catch air on a kiteboard, cool off with a swim, or join the locals floating down the channel on a hot afternoon.

...ALMOST

Some experiences need wheels, but you can still minimize your carbon footprint. Let local operators take the wheel while you focus on the views. Penticton's wine tour operators, adventure shuttle services, and local transport providers help reduce emissions by combining travelers on a single trip. Share a ride, skip the traffic, and keep Penticton's air clean while you explore.



PENTICTON ALE TRAIL

In the heart of wine country, Penticton's thriving craft beer scene has earned us the title of Canada's Craft Beer Capital from Lonely Planet. Our distinctive breweries each offer unique experiences, from estate-grown barley beers to two level tasting rooms. The city's craft brewing culture pairs perfectly with our local food scene, featuring everything from Mexicaninspired cuisine to homestyle pub fare and legendary nachos. You'll discover award-winning beers crafted with local fruits, welcoming patios, and dog-friendly establishments throughout – all within walking distance of downtown.



NARAMATA BENCH WINE FLAVOUR TRAIL

Discover the Naramata Bench, starting with breakfast in downtown Penticton. Rent an e-bike and cruise the KVR Trail, where artisanal cheese makers and wineries welcome you with local tastings. After hiking Naramata Falls, explore award-winning wineries and cideries offering everything from classic vintages to French-inspired craft ciders. Stop for lunch at one of several bistros featuring locally-sourced cuisine. Your return journey crosses the McCulloch Trestle, offering stunning lake views beneath Penticton's iconic hillside sign on Munson Mountain.



DOWNTOWN ARTS CULINARY TRAIL

Discover downtown Penticton's flavours and local culture on this bike-friendly trail. Start your morning at one of our artisanal coffee houses, known for their craft beverages and fresh-made breakfast specialties. Follow the Lake to Lake bike route to explore our city's artistic side through local galleries showcasing both contemporary and traditional works. For lunch, step into a downtown eatery, where local cuisine pairs perfectly with Okanagan vintages. Cap off your day with innovative Asian fusion dining and treat yourself to locally-made ice cream, a favourite summer tradition.



NARAMATA BENCH SECTION

Easily accessible from downtown, the best place to start is by parking on Vancouver Ave and then accessing the KVR Trail at the end of Vancouver Place. As you leave the city behind, you'll find yourself on the eastern ridge of the Naramata Bench, surrounded by vineyards and lake views.

The gentle 2.2% grade makes this perfect for:

- Casual walks
- Family bike rides
- Wine country exploring
- Photography stops

Want a goal? Ride or walk to Little Tunnel lookout, a 32 km round trip (about 2.5 hours by bike) from downtown.

BEYOND PENTICTON

NORTH ROUTE

- Access from Trout Creek area in Summerland
- Park at Fenwick Road
- Head toward Prairie Valley KVR Station, continue to Faulder & take in the impressive landscapes beyond

SOUTH ROUTE


Start at Wright's Beach Camp for a 26 km ride round trip ride to Okanagan Falls:

- Follow Skaha Lake's shoreline
- Pass through Kaleden village
- Cross the Trestle Bridge
- Plan for a 3-hour round trip by bike

The KVR welcomes you year-round. Walk it in spring bloom, bike it in summer sun, catch fall colors, or try fat-biking in winter. Every season brings new views of our valley, lakes, and mountains.

SAFETY FIRST

The section from Faulder allows vehicles, so bring appropriate bike tires. Between The Little Tunnel and Ruth Station (Kelowna), be especially alert as this section permits motorized traffic.









WALKING TRAILS

Looking for an easy stroll? Penticton's flat, accessible paths connect our lakes, creeks, and neighborhoods. These routes work for strollers, wheelchairs, and casual walks. Pack water and a hat, and make sure to wear sunscreen - most paths offer valley views but limited shade.

IN PENTICTON

PENTICTON CREEK WALK

9 km round trip on paved paths Start at Ikeda Gardens by the Art Gallery

- Follow the creek to the Water Treatment Plant
- Perfect for strollers, dogs, and all ages

CHANNEL PATHWAYS

14 km round trip on packed gravel Start at the Rose Garden on Riverside Drive

- Lake-to-lake route along the water
- Note: Limited shade in summer months

KVR TRAILS MCCULLOCH TRESTLE ROUTE

5 km round trip on mixed surfaces Start at Vancouver Place

- Pass vineyards to reach the historic trestle
- Gentle grade on the old rail line

SOUTH SPUR TO OK FALLS

28 km round trip on groomed paths Start at Wright's Beach Camp

- Follow Skaha Lake to Okanagan Falls
- Cross the restored railway trestle

NEARBY WALKS

HARDY FALLS (PEACHLAND)

3.5 km round trip

Start at Hardy Street off Highway 97

- · Wheelchair and stroller friendly
- Waterfall at trail's end

VASEUX LAKE MIGRATORY BIRD SANCTUARY (OKANAGAN FALLS)

2 km round trip along a board walk to an observation tower Start at parking lot just off Hwy 97, at northern end of the lake

Great for birding and nature walks

ELLIS RIDGE TRAIL

Start at the Garnet Fire Interpretive Site parking lot

- Moderate difficulty with some cliff edges
- Connect to Canyon View for a longer hike

CARMI RECREATIONAL TRAILS

OKANAGAN VIEW LOOP

7 km loop, moderate difficulty Start just off Beaverdell Road

- Forest trails with vista points
- · Warming hut and benches at lookout

NARAMATA AREA

LITTLE TUNNEL

9 km easy to moderate grade round trip Start at Smethurst Road

- Valley views to Skaha Lake
- Iconic photography spot

NARAMATA CREEK FALLS

2.5 km round trip

Start from the Naramata Creek Park parking lot

- Multiple creek crossings
- Shaded forest trail

REGIONAL HIKES

NSAYLINTN (MCINTYRE BLUFF)

10.5 km round trip

Start at Willowbrook Park, Oliver

- Moderate difficulty with great views
- Small access fee at trailhead

GIANT'S HEAD (SUMMERLAND)

5 km round trip

Multiple route start options

- Moderate to difficult climb
- Panoramic views at summit

PEACH CLIFF (OK FALLS)

4 km round trip

Start at McLean Creek Road

- Steep scramble near top
- Views of Skaha Lake





All routes start from downtown Penticton. Local bike shops Freedom Bike Shop or The Bike Barn offer repairs, rentals, and route advice. Stop by for current road conditions and seasonal tips.

QUICK RIDES

NARAMATA BENCH (30 KM)

Total Climb: 310 m || Peak Elevation: 471 m This out and back ride takes you from Downtown Penticton, through lush vineyards and orchards along Naramata Bench Road into the quaint village of Naramata. The vistas over Okanagan Lake along the way are spectacular.

OKANAGAN FALLS (45 KM)

Total climb: 222 m || Peak elevation: 462 m Starting from Downtown Penticton, you travel through the heart of the city, then along Eastside Road, which hugs the east shoreline of Skaha Lake and connects to MacLean Creek Road. Once you reach Okanagan Falls, you'll circle past a number of boutique wineries before heading back along the east shoreline of Skaha Lake, following Eastside Road.

CHALLENGE RIDES

WHITE LAKE LOOP (70 KM)

Total climb: 468 m || Peak elevation: 608 m Initially, you follow the same direction as the Okanagan Falls ride, but you continue to ride south through the village of Okanagan Falls and then head west, along Green Lake Road towards Willowbrook. This is a great ride to take in the diverse landscapes of the region, as you skirt White Lake Grasslands Protected Area and return along the west side of Skaha Lake, following Highway 97.

PACA 100 (103 KM)

Total climb: 747 m || Peak elevation: 607 m

A challenging loop from Penticton to Oliver. You'll be able to take in views of the lakes, wineries and wildlife, while pushing yourself through some technical climb sections along the way.

MOUNTAIN BIKING

Mountain bikers have called our ridges, benches, and rocks home since the 1970s. Today, our trail networks offer everything from gentle greens to technical challenges, all within 15 minutes of downtown.

Thanks to the Penticton and Area Cycling Association (PACA), our trails receive regular maintenance, upgrades, and clear signage.

GOLF

Golf season starts early in Penticton, with players teeing off almost year-round thanks to our sunny, dry climate. Our courses range from championship layouts to quick nine-hole rounds, all set against mountain and lake views.

NEARBY COURSES

Just south of Penticton, **St. Andrews by the Lake Golf Resort** is a scenic nine-hole course featuring rolling hills, a sparkling lake, and its signature 7th hole—a 165-yard par 3 with an island green. Voted the best nine-hole course in the South Okanagan for four years running, it offers a challenge for all skill levels. Enjoy the

clubhouse's full-service restaurant and bar, or relax on the lakeside deck with stunning course views.

Head south to Oliver and try Fairview Mountain Golf Course, designed by Les Furber. Along with its playable layout for all skill levels, you'll find complete practice facilities including a driving range, short game area, putting green, and bunker practice. The Fairview Mountain Lounge offers a licensed restaurant and two outdoor patios with valley views.


Continue south to **Osoyoos Golf Club**, home to two distinct 18-hole courses. Choose between the unique desert links course (cart mandatory) or the walkable parkland layout, surrounded by orchards and vineyards. The clubhouse features a pro shop and three dining spaces with deck views of the course.

All courses sit within an hour's drive of Penticton.

On Okanagan Lake, Pier Water Sports adds to the excitement with Sea-Doo rentals, wakeboard sessions, parasailing and banana boat rides.

For those seeking a more peaceful adventure, explore the shoreline by paddle board, kayak, or canoe. Hoodoo Adventures provides both rentals and guided tours, perfect for discovering hidden coves or visiting nearby communities by water. Whatever your style, our experienced guides can equip you with gear and local knowledge to make the most of your time on the water.

THE CHANNEL FLOAT

Our iconic 7 km channel float connects Okanagan Lake to Skaha Lake (and that's 'Channel' - not Canal!)

Start at Coyote Cruises on Riverside Drive and drift past the golf course to Skaha Lake. Need a break? Stop at Green Mountain Road halfway.

Coyote Cruises Rentals

- Single and double tubes with cup holders
- Party islands for 4-12 people
- Return shuttle service
- Safe storage for valuables

Support our environmental efforts by renting from Coyote Cruises rather than bringing disposable tubes.

CHANNEL FLOAT TIPS

Use caution when floating the channel as water levels and wind can change

Use sunscreen and stay hydrated – it can take 3-4 hours to float the entire length of the channel

Ensure small children and non-swimmers wear a lifejacket or floatation device

Keep valuables (keys, wallet, phone, etc.) in a waterproof bag or container

Stay clear of bridge pilings and do not go past the final bridge into Skaha Lake

Do not tie floatation devices together and it is not recommended to float alone

Please make sure you properly discard your flat or damaged floaties

Do not leave litter lying around or in the channel





BEACHES

From golden sand to shaded parks, Penticton's beaches invite you to dive into lake life. Here are our top spots to splash, swim, and soak up the sun.

OKANAGAN BEACH

A kilometer of premium sandy beach stretches between the historic SS Sicamous and our giant peach. Walk straight from downtown hotels to find your perfect spot on the sand. With restaurants and craft breweries nearby, you can easily spend a full day here.

SKAHA LAKE PARK

One of Canada's top-rated beaches mixes active fun with peaceful relaxation. The red sand beach meets green parkland, offering:

- Volleyball courts and baseball field
- Children's splash pad and playgrounds
- Scenic walkways along the water
- · Concession stands for snacks
- Plenty of picnic spots

SUDBURY BEACH

This spacious stretch of Skaha Lake sand draws both swimmers and wind sport enthusiasts. Watch windsurfers and kiteboarders catch air on breezy days, or join a game of beach volleyball.

THREE MILE BEACH

Between Penticton and Naramata, this beach offers two unique experiences. The south-facing area welcomes dogs and boats for day moorage, while the north side features fine sand and bluff views.

Note: a clothing optional section sits past the main stairway.

RESPONSIBLE CONSUMPTION

Enjoy a drink at select locations from noon to 9 p.m. year-round:

- Okanagan Beach (East of Power Street)
- Rotary Park
- Okanagan Lake Park
- Marina Way Park
- Skaha Lake Park West

Note: You must be 19 or older to purchase and consume alcohol in BC. Public intoxication is not permitted. The boardwalk along Okanagan Beach is not included in consumption areas. Keep our beaches clean - littering of glass, bottles, or cans will result in a fine.



FAMILY ATTRACTIONS

Penticton offers family activities in every season. You'll find beaches for relaxing, trails for exploring, and plenty of ice cream stops along the way.

THINGS TO DO WITH YOUR FAMILY

- Get ice cream at local spots Cherry on Top, Lickity Splitz, or Tickleberry's in Penticton and Okanagan Falls
- See the town by bike rent e-bikes from Pedego Penticton or choose a standard bike or multi-person pedal bike from Penticton Bike Rentals
- Watch cars race and monster trucks perform at Penticton Speedway, where you can catch oval track racing and hit-2-pass events
- Meet and pet farm animals including goats and chickens at GottaGoat Farm
- Play at LocoLanding Adventure Park, which features mini-golf, go-karts, bumper boats, and rope courses
- Use the public parks, which include playgrounds, nature areas, skating spots, sports courts, and picnic spaces with food stands
- Challenge your family to a Clue Solvers adventure an outdoor escape room meets scavenger hunt that takes you on a 90-minute journey through downtown. Using their app, follow clues and solve puzzles while exploring Penticton's streets and landmarks
- Cool off at the splash pads at Lakawana Park or Skaha Beach
- Swim and exercise at the Community Centre's pools featuring lap lanes, a lazy river, water slides, hot tub, sauna, and gym
- Check out family shows, Penticton Vees hockey, and the BC Hockey Hall of Fame at the South Okanagan Events Centre

Explore our local museums, galleries, and arts and culture scene

In Penticton Indigenous heritage, contemporary arts, and diverse community traditions converge. From downtown's historic streets adorned with public art to intimate performance venues, and from traditional syilx cultural sites to international festivals, the city pulses with creative energy that honours both its past and present.







ART SPACES & GALLERIES

The Penticton Art Gallery stands as a cornerstone of the local art scene, hosting thought-provoking exhibitions that bridge local talent with international perspectives. Gallery One Twenty-Seven and The Lloyd Gallery offer carefully curated collections that showcase the Okanagan's most compelling artists. For those seeking a more intimate experience, Cormier Studio and The Leir House Cultural Centre provide unique spaces where visitors can connect directly with artists and their creative processes.

LIVE MUSIC & ENTERTAINMENT

The Dream Café has earned its reputation as Penticton's premier listening room, hosting over 100 performances annually in its warm, intimate setting. This Front Street gem combines exceptional dining with an impressive roster of folk, blues,

jazz, and world music artists. Meanwhile, The Hub on Martin Street keeps weekends lively with local bands energizing the crowd, complemented by hearty pub fare and popular weekend brunches.

THEATRE & PERFORMANCE

The Many Hats Theatre Company delivers compelling live performances throughout the year, while The Tempest offers incredibly curated performances and dramatic art classes. These companies bring both classic works and contemporary productions to life, enriching Penticton's performing arts landscape.

FESTIVALS & EVENTS

A highlight of Penticton's cultural calendar is the Ignite the Arts Festival, a dynamic spring event that transforms the downtown core into a hub of creativity and energy. This vibrant celebration

showcases over 50 diverse acts, filling the streets with live music, theatrical performances, dance exhibitions, and family-friendly activities.

Penticton also hosts the Snakebite Film Festival, a must-attend event for film enthusiasts. This festival celebrates the art of storytelling through cinema, featuring a curated selection of independent films from local and international filmmaker, and an always sell out 5-Day Film Challenge event and screening.



The Standard Space serves as a dynamic cultural hub, regularly transforming to host art exhibitions, artisan markets, and pop-up shops that spotlight local creators. Head on into the Cannery Trade Centre and visit Donut House Studios, a collaborative place which offers classes and workshops for artists, creatives and makers to grow.

HERITAGE

The syilx peoples have lived in this region for time immemorial. Visit the syilx Indian Residential School Monument and its sculpture "Bringing Our Kids Home" to learn about this history. In our region eight Indigenous communities make up the Okanagan Nation Alliance: Okanagan Indian Band, Upper Nicola Band, Westbank First Nation, Penticton Indian Band, Osoyoos Indian Band, Lower and Upper Similkameen Indian Bands, and the Colville Confederated Tribe. In addition to this, The South Okanagan Similkameen Métis Association welcomes visitors to its cultural center on Winnipeg Street.

South Okanagan Immigrant and Community Services (SOICS) hosts international food festivals, the OneWorld Festival, and community programs at its Ellis Street location.

- Visit the Penticton Museum & Archives to see hands-on exhibits about the South Okanagan.
- The 1937 PENTICTON sign perched on Munson Mountain offers a perfect photo opportunity while overlooking the city.
- Historic downtown buildings showcase the city's architectural heritage, with many structures dating back to the early 1900s.
- The SS Sicamous stern wheeler, now a museum and heritage site, offers visitors a glimpse into the region's maritime history.
- Public art installations and sculptures line Front Street and the Okanagan Lake waterfront adding character to your lakeside stroll.













MARKETS & FRESH FOOD

Peaches, cherries, and apples - the Okanagan Valley's warm days and cool nights create perfect conditions for growing Canada's most coveted fruits. Each season brings new harvests: cherries herald the start of summer, followed by waves of apricots, plums, peaches, pears, and apples. You'll also find rainbow-hued heirloom tomatoes and sweet berries bursting with flavour.

FARM FRESH OPTIONS

- Pick your own fruit at local farms or stop at roadside stands throughout Penticton and the South Okanagan
- Buy fresh meat, eggs, cheese, honey, preserves, and local crafts directly from farmers
- Meet growers and makers at weekly markets

LOCAL MARKETS

The Penticton Farmers' Market runs Saturday mornings from April to October on Main Street. Every vendor makes, bakes, or grows their products.

You'll find:

- · Fresh fruits and vegetables
- Eggs and honey
- Baked goods
- Preserves
- Handmade crafts
- Local wine, beer, and spirits for tasting

The Downtown Community Market opens Saturdays from May to September along Main Street, Front Street, and Backstreet Boulevard. Stroll through rows of vendors selling handmade clothing and jewelry, sample food from local makers, and hunt for unique antiques and collectibles. Street musicians and performers add to the lively atmosphere, making this outdoor market a weekly celebration of local talent and creativity.

Kids laugh it up at the Ha Ha Ha Kidzfest, and sports enthusiasts can cheer on outrigger canoe clubs from BC and Alberta during the Duel in the Desert, a thrilling 12-14 km race on Skaha Lake. Round out your spring with the Penticton Beer Run and some friendly competition at the Megavolt E-MTB Fest.

SUMMER FUN

Summer packs the calendar with weekly events. Watch classic cars cruise by at the Peach City Beach Cruise, or catch tribute artists at the Penticton Elvis Festival. The Penticton Scottish Festival brings Highland games and culture, while the Peach Classic Triathlon challenges athletes. Celebrate syilx culture and resilience at the Pow Wow Between the Lakes, a vibrant gathering of the eight bands of the Okanagan Nation Alliance. Cyclists take to scenic routes in the Okanagan Trestles Tour, Okanagan Granfondo, and The Kettle Mettle Dirty Fondo. Volleyball enthusiasts can dive into the action at the JCI Penticton Beach Volleyball Tournament. Don't miss Penticton's signature Peach Festival for family entertainment, or the annual Penticton Regional Bridge Tournament, Canada's largest regional event.

FALL FESTIVITIES

The Pentastic Hot Jazz & Music Festival kicks off fall with three days of lively performances, featuring dixieland, zydeco, big band, and rockabilly across multiple venues. On the water, dragon boat teams race during the energetic Dragonboat Festival, welcoming 2000+ atheletes. Beer lovers rejoice during Penticton Beer Week, a celebration of local brews and craft beer culture, and curling fans can watch top athletes compete in the Curling Classic. For pop culture enthusiasts, Penti-Con is a weekend of fun with vendor booths, workshops, panels, and family-friendly activities.

WINTER WARMTH

Winter in Penticton brings cozy events and indoor excitement. Magic on Main Street lights up downtown with festive charm, while the Valley First Frost Fest Winter Carnival energizes the season with three days of family-friendly fun, featuring a family movie night, all-day ice activities hosted by the Penticton Vees, a snowboard rail jam, and a frosty toes winter swim in Okanagan Lake. Film buffs gather for the Snakebite Film Festival, a celebration of cinematic art. A highlight is the five-day film challenge, where teams create unique short films based on specific prompts, showcasing incredible creativity and storytelling. Cultures also come together at the OneWorld Multicultural Festival, a vibrant celebration of diversity through music, dance, and food.


WINTER IN PENTICTON

DOWNHILL ADVENTURE

Apex Mountain Resort, located just 30 minutes from downtown, is a full-service winter destination boasting 1,112 skiable acres and an impressive 2,000 feet of vertical terrain. The resort caters to skiers and snowboarders of all abilities, from beginners to experts, with its diverse range of runs. After a day on the slopes, visitors can unwind at the famous Gunbarrel Saloon, known for its vibrant après ski scene. Further south, about an hour's drive from Penticton, lies Baldy Mountain Resort, featuring meticulously maintained gladed areas, well-groomed runs, and peaceful snowshoe trails that wind through serene forest landscapes.

NORDIC & SNOWSHOE

Nickel Plate Nordic Centre is a premier cross-country skiing destination offering 56 km of groomed ski trails, 22 km of marked snowshoe routes, and a dog-friendly 1.6 km trail for adventures with your four-legged friends. The centre provides convenient equipment rentals and professional lessons for all skill levels. Thanks to its high elevation, it boasts one of Canada's longest Nordic seasons, giving winter sports enthusiasts plenty of time to enjoy the trails.





WINTER TRAILS

Our temperate climate keeps local trails open year-round. Explore the Kettle Valley Rail Trail, Campbell Mountain, or Three Blind Mice on foot or fat-bike. The Carmi Recreational Trail Network offers great snowshoeing through forest settings rent gear from Hoodoo Adventures.

ICE SKATING IN PENTICTON

Downtown Outdoor Rink offers refrigerated ice between Gyro Park and City Hall, with daily skating from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. Alternates between family skating and shinny (hockey) days.

NARAMATA



NARAMATA BENCH NARAMATA BENCH WINERY ASSOCIATION naramatabench.com

Stretching along the eastern shores of Okanagan Lake, this celebrated bench land features more than 40 wineries dotting a 14-kilometer scenic drive. Known for its mineral-rich soil and cooling lake breezes, the region excels in aromatic whites and complex reds, particularly Pinot Noir and Syrah. The combination of lake views, boutique wineries, and the historic KVR Trail makes this area a must-visit wine destination.

OKANAGAN FALLS | SKAHA LAKE THE HEART OF WINE COUNTRY theheartofwinecountry.ca

Nestled between Skaha and Vaseux Lakes, this region's unique terroir benefits from the moderating effects of two lakes and dramatic elevation changes. The area's rocky soils and warm climate produce outstanding Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, and bold reds. Local wineries range from intimate family-run operations to architecturally stunning estates, many offering panoramic lake views from their tasting rooms.

SUMMERLAND -

BOTTLENECK DRIVE ASSOCIATION bottleneckdrive.com

Winding through the western hills above Okanagan Lake, Bottleneck Drive features wineries known for their intimate tasting experiences and innovative approaches. The area's varied elevations and aspects create distinct microclimates perfect for growing everything from crisp Rieslings to full-bodied Merlots. Along the route you will also find producers of craft cider and spirits, adding variety to the tasting experience.


OLIVER & OSOYOOS OLIVER OSOYOOS WINE COUNTRY

Officially known as "Canada's Wine Capital," this sun-soaked region stretches through the southern Okanagan Valley and produces nearly half of BC's wines. The desert-like climate and diverse soil types support everything from delicate whites to powerful reds, with Bordeaux varieties thriving in the heat. The area boasts both pioneering family estates and cutting-edge new ventures, including many organic and biodynamic producers.

SIMILKAMEEN VALLEY SIMILKAMEEN INDEPENDENT WINEGROWERS similkameenwine.com

Just west of the Okanagan, this emerging wine region is gaining recognition for its distinctive terroir. Strong winds, mineral-rich soils, and dramatic temperature swings create intensely flavoured grapes. Known for organic farming practices and award-winning Syrah, Cabernet Franc, and Viognier, the valley's rugged beauty and authentic farm-to-glass experiences offer a more off-the-beaten-path wine adventure.



DISTRICT WINE VILLAGE

In Oliver, the District Wine Village brings together numerous wineries, a brewery, a distillery, and a restaurant in one location. This first-of-its-kind village in Canada creates a community of local artisans sharing their craft.

Features include:

- A 610-person amphitheater for events
- An on-site vineyard
- Shared production facilities
- A central plaza hosting markets and gatherings, and a skating rink in winter months

The village grew from a local dream to bring wine lovers and makers together. Today it serves as both a production hub and a destination where you can sample multiple producers in one stop.



BC VQA WINE INFORMATION

The BC VQA Wine Information Centre is a must-visit destination for wine lovers exploring British Columbia's wine country. As the largest retailer of BC VQA wines, it offers over 900 wines from more than 150 local wineries, all certified under the BC Vintners Quality Alliance (VQA) standards, ensuring authenticity and quality.

The centre is a hub for wine enthusiasts, offering expert guidance from knowledgeable staff, an Icon Room featuring exclusive BC wines, and a selection of wine accessories, gourmet foods, and gift items. Visitors can join the BC Wine Club for curated wine shipments or arrange hassle-free shipping for their purchases. It's more than a store—it's a celebration of BC wine and a commitment to supporting the local wine industry.

CRAFT SPIRITS






The Okanagan's recreational cannabis industry offers locally-curated experiences in line with Canada's federal regulations.



PENTICTON IS THE HUB OF THE SOUTH OKANAGAN

Make Penticton your home base and take easy day trips in any direction. Start your morning with breakfast in Penticton, explore a nearby town, and return for dinner at one of Penticton's lakeside restaurants. Each community is close enough for a quick visit but distinct enough to merit its own adventure.

NORTH OF PENTICTON

NARAMATA (14 KM, 20 MINUTES)

Take a scenic drive along Naramata Road, winding through picturesque vineyards and orchards while visiting boutique wineries along the renowned Naramata Bench. Adventure seekers can bike the Little Tunnel on the KVR Trail or explore the natural beauty of Naramata Creek Falls. The village offers unique shopping experiences, from sustainable fashion at Shades of Linen to beachwear and paddleboarding gear at Sun n' Sup, with the Naramata General Store providing quick lunch options and groceries.

SUMMERLAND (15 KM, 15 MINUTES)

Discover breathtaking valley views from the summit of Giant's Head Mountain or take a nostalgic ride on the historic Kettle and Summerland Sweets for unique local treats.

PEACHLAND (33 KM, 30 MINUTES)

Enjoy a leisurely stroll along the waterfront promenade or challenge yourself with a hike up Pincushion Mountain for stunning lake views. Adventure seekers can access the KVR Trail system or experience high flying thrills at ZipZone Peachland.

SOUTH OF PENTICTON

KALEDEN (13 KM, 10 MINUTES)

Experience the tranquil beauty of Linden Gardens and enjoy lunch at the charming Frog City Café. History buffs can explore the mysterious Kaleden Hotel ruins, while those seeking relaxation can unwind at Pioneer Park on Skaha Lake.

OKANAGAN FALLS (19 KM, 15 MINUTES)

Cool off with a famous treat from Tickleberry's Ice Cream, cycle the scenic KVR Trail along Skaha Lake, or explore the Peach Cliff trails. Visitors can also enjoy fishing at serene Vaseux Lake.

OLIVER (43 KM, 40 MINUTES)

Known as Canada's Wine Capital, Oliver offers countless activities for visitors. Explore the innovative District Wine Village, spot wild horses and rare wildlife in their natural habitat, or hike through desert trails. Wine enthusiasts can tour dozens of wineries, while fiber artists and fashion lovers can visit GN'R Alpaca, a boutique specializing in luxurious alpaca fiber products.

CANADA'S CRAFT BEER CAPITAL

Lonely Planet named Penticton "Canada's craft beer capital" in 2020, and for good reason. This vibrant Okanagan city has been a hub of craft brewing excellence for over 25 years, earning a reputation as a must-visit destination for beer enthusiasts. With seven breweries making up the Penticton Ale Trail—also known as the Penticton Beer Blocks—this compact, walkable area offers a diverse range of flavours, styles, and experiences that showcase the creativity and passion of local brewers.

Penticton Beer Blocks

LOCAL BREWERIES

- Abandoned Rail Brewing: A family run brewery that turns their estate grown barley into European inspired beers. Soak up the sun on their dog-friendly patios grab some pizza while you're there!
